**ANIMAL COLLECTIVE Strawberry Jam** (Domino) Proof of evolution as the collected animals herein coo out melodies and cry out otherworldly yelps layered between not-guitars, bubbly rainforest synths, stampeding drums, and the sounds of life in a fashion more together and pure than ever before. These are 9 songs of encompassing spirit and sound and they will wrap you up in gold and silver sheets.

**AKRON/FAMILY Love Is Simple** (Young God) Here we see Akron/Family at the relative apex of their career: an album that most seamlessly blends the slow, unravelling beauty of their self-titled debut and the fiery, uninhibited bombast of their more recent material. If the communal singalongs and endlessly spiraling orchestrations of "Ed Is A Portal" don't bring the inner shaman out of you, you should see a doctor because you are soulless.

**DIRTY PROJECTORS Rise Above** (Dead Oceans) Yale dropout Dave Longtreth attempts to rerecord Black Flag's "Damaged" from memory, and it turns out exactly the same...except for the choir vocals, flute solos, string sections, jaw-dropping musicianship and sounding like it was recorded by an evolved race of humans 2,000 years in the future.

**OKHERVIL RIVER The Stage Names** (Jagjaguwar) Another album of fantastic songwriting and amazing lyrical content from this Austin-based alt-country/indie band. With just enough slide guitar to sate my inner cracker and enough "meta" to satisfy even the biggest McSweeney's geek.

**THE ANGELS OF LIGHT We Are Him** (Young God) Aging ex-Swans frontman Michael Gira's latest album has the excellent Akron/Family backing up his dark, threatening goth-folk. Songs like "Sometimes I Dream I'm Hurting You" are guaranteed to get you put on some sort of government surveillance list.

**VARIOUS ARTISTS Need for a Crossing: A New New Zealand Vol. 1** (Table of Elements) Elements of drone, guitar distortion, damaged grunge and folk, emotions streaming throughout with touches of noise and distortion to balance things out. Dreamy damaged melodies float around, altering your perceptions from sadness to euphoria.

**LOST BAYOU RAMBLERS Live a La Blue Moon** (Swallow) One of the leading young bands in Cajun music delivers a full album of swingin' Cajun sounds in their distinctive style, all from one night at the legendary Lafayette club.

**THE BLACK DAHLIA MURDER Nocturnal** (Metal Blade) The third offering by this American melodic death metal band emphasizes less melody and more lightning speed death metal this time around. Excellent guitar work and solos highlight superb songwriting and crushing composition. Prepare yourself for this dark and grim metal onslaught.

**DETHKLOK The Dethalbum** (Williams Street) Finally a full-length from the greatest fictional death metal band of all time. The music created by characters of Adult Swim's hit animated show Metalocalypse has been released as an album at long last. Listen or die!

**JASON RICCI & NEW BLOOD Rocket Number 9** (Eclecto Groove Records) A visionary and sonically explosive masterpiece that is sure to shake your foundations while redefining the sound of the harmonica in the process.

**ACADIEAN CAJUN BAND All Night Long** (Swallow Records) Ryan Simon and company prove they're the real deal on this second outing, with a mix of trads and originals, and some help from the Pine Leaf Boys' Drew Simon, proving the new Cajun revival is alive and kickin'.

**BEDOUIN SOUNDCLASH Street Gospels** (Sideonedummy Records) Canadians have done it again, ay? This is an album you can fall asleep to, like a soothing baby lullaby. But don't let their name fool you, because their mix of reggae roots and soul in no way has a sound that clashes.

**THE VELVET UNDERGROUND Loaded** (Warner) Have you heard this album? No...seriously, dude. Have you HEARD THIS F\*CKING ALBUM?

**MAD CADDIES Keep It Going** (Fat Wreck Chords) This seven-piece band has always been great at combining punk and ska and this album is no different. You can't help but smile when listening to ska, and the Mad Caddies will make you smile as big as a 5 year-old at their first cheesy school picture in Kindergarten.

**GOGOL BORDELLO Super Tantra** (SideoneDummy Records) Gypsy Cabaret punks from New York, oh my. They sound like nothing else, so Gogol Bordello needs no further introduction.

**QUANTIC SOUL ORCHESTRA Tropidelico** (Tru Thoughts) Will Holland aka Quantic leads the band in their 4th full length album. This time there's plenty of Descarga and Latin rhythms mixed in with some quality deep funk, soul, and hip-hop that make this release a sureshot.

**VARIOUS ARTISTS Gilles Peterson Digs America Vol.2** (Luv N Haight) World renowned tastemaker and disc jockey, Mr. Peterson goes digging once again and comes up with plenty of rare and unreleased gems — 18 pieces of top notch groove, soul, jazz and funk for hungry ears.

**DOWN III: Over The Under** (ILG) Everyone's favorite southern fried hard rock band featuring members of Pantera, Corrosion of Conformity, Crowbar, and Eyehategod is back with a vengeance on 12 tracks of brooding rock with Down's trademark style and sound — five years of catastrophe, tragedy, and triumph in musical form.

**SODOM The Final Sign of Evil** (SPV) This German thrash band has re-recorded their original 1984 debut EP, "In the Sign of Evil," added 7 additional tracks and created a full length album with the original band members who have rejoined the effort to form the three piece that started it all. Thrash away!!

**ZYDECO TED Texas Zydeco** Former squeezemaster from the Zydeco Dots cooks up another tasty collection of originals that's a bit like an accordion wielding Dr. John hopped up on country hot sauce.

**NEBENVELT Geiger** After gaining east coast exposure with their Tara CD, Gabriel Buday (alias DJZJ), Toxic, Greg Rhom and company are back with more bubble bounce weight drop electronic experimentation.
