
KUCI 88.9 FM SUMMER 2007 music listening guide

THE BLOW Poor Aim: Love Songs (K) This rerelease of an out-of-print EP, with handful of new remixes, gives a fresh dose of intimate and fun electro-pop to soundtrack your all-night, underpants dance parties (underpants optional).

BATTLES Mirrored (Warp) There is absolutely no reason music as complicated, clean, and intricate as this album should be anywhere near this accessible. Damn you, you charming titans of math-rock!





DAN DEACON Spiderman of the Rings (Carpark) Coming out of Baltimore with a flurry of dada-istic, spazzy electro anthems, Dan Deacon wants you to dance "sassy as #@&, like you have a purple ring and you killed the devil." If that doesn't sound like the best thing you've ever heard, I'm not sure I want you at my sexy mini-golf tournament.

CALVIN JOHNSON & THE SONS OF THE SOIL Calvin Johnson & the Soil (K) The Lord of the DIY baritone troubadours, and founder of K Records, releases an album of songs spanning his back catalog, now recorded with a full band. If you complain about his voice, I'm gonna make a necklace of your teeth.

PINE LEAF BOYS Blues de Musicien (Arhoolie) The wild bunch from Lafayette deliver the traditional goods in their signature rowdy fashion once more, with some tasty covers and impressive originals, on this their second release.

JIM OLIVIER The Essential Collection (Swallow) Some Cajun 'eighties music', and a new one from the singer turned businessman. With tunes like "Wait Until I Finish Crying" and "Marriage on the Rocks", Olivier will remind you where the honky tonk got you.

NOTHINGTON All In (Byo Records) With a good mix of pop-punk and gritty rock n roll, San Francisco's Nothington brings one of the best punk albums of 2007. Featuring former members of Tsunami Bomb and Enemy You, All In will have you singing along, raising your glass at the first chorus.

PATRICK WOLF The Magic Position (Low Altitude) Another strong outing from this young, fresh-faced Londoner. In addition to writing catchy electropop songs, playing the ukulele, guitar, piano, and singing, he looks good in a a pair of short shorts. It's the damnedest thing I ever saw.

MAD CADDIES Keep It Going (Fat Wreck Chords) Mad Caddies are back with their fifth and best studio album to date. With the help of producer Wayne Jobson (No Doubt, Toots and the Maytals), the Caddies blend Jamaican roots ska, reggae and dancehall while still maintaining their punk and Dixieland hybrid.

SUN RA & HIS ASTRO INFINITY ARKESTRA Strange Strings (Atavistic) Originally released in 1967, the Strange Strings sessions is what Sun Ra called, "a study in ignorance". Why? The musicians used for these sessions had no idea how to play the collection of exotic and discarded string instruments Ra handed them. While the result is less conventional then Sun Ra's Space is The Place soundtrack, Strange Strings will pull you in for listen after listen.

CINEMATIC ORCHESTRA Ma Fleur (Domino / Ninja Tune) Jason Swinscoe and company are back with another LP full of raw emotion. Guest vocalists Lou Rhodes, Patrick Watson, and legendary jazz/soul vocalist Fontella Bass all contribute to make a record at once both uplifting and melancholy.


THE AGGROLITES Reggae Hit L.A. (Hellcat Records) Coming off of a hot Hellcat Records debut and a recording session as Tim Armstrong's (Rancid) back-up band. The Aggrolites are striking hard with their latest studio release Reggae Hit LA. Flawlessly recreating the rocksteady sound of the early 60's Studio One recordings, The Aggs are the new kings of Jamaican ska and rocksteady. Pretty good for a band out of Los Angeles.

SYMPHONY X Paradise Lost (Inside Out Music) For all the fans of 80s style power metal comes another excellent release by Symphony X, who have been crafting their trade out of New Jersey since the early 90s. Unlike their previous concept album *Odyssey* (see Homer ((not Simpson)), this release is a venture in solid songwriting and performance.

SLEEPYTIME GORILLA MUSEUM in Glorious Times (The End Records)
The strange and glorious Sleepytime Gorilla Museum ("SGM") currently lead the charge in avant-rock with lullaby melodies that suddenly shift to distorted, creepy rhythms and screamed vocals.

JOB FOR A COWBOY Genesis (Metal Blade Records) After the initial success of their self-released deathcore EP titled Doom, these rising stars from Glendale, Arizona, have come back for more with this straightforward death metal release. Incorporating the best influences of bands like Morbid Angel and Suffocation, Genesis is guaranteed to start carnage in the mosh pit.

DREAM THEATER Systematic Chaos (Roadrunner Records) Progressive rock enthusiasts can cheer once more! Dream Theater have finally released their follow up album to 2005's fantastic Octavarium — complete with more time changes and quirkiness than Y2K.
