MAE SHI HLLLYH (Team Shi) I couldn't tell you why the new vowelphobic Mae Shi record "HLLLYH" has three Ls in the title. What I can tell you is that, after putting out two and a half full-length records in two years of manic-go-lucky, weirdo-punk, "HLLLYH" is their crowning achievement; the amalgamation of everything that makes them the most exciting and interesting band in Los Angeles. The Mae Shi say they are "reaching for pop gold" and with "HLLLYH" they have basically gone platinum. sF

JEFFREY LEWIS 12 Crass Songs (Rough Trade) Anti-folk troubadour, comic book artist and amateur historian Jeffrey Lewis has released a collection of covers by seminal anarcho-punk band Crass, rewritten as anti-folk tunes. Sure we're missing out on Lewis's clever lyrics about being raped by Bonnie "Prince" Billy in Williamsburg or Leonard Cohen's oral sex-related songwriting zeniths, but fans of either band will probably find plenty to love. kO

NOBODY PRESENTS BLANK BLUE Western Water Music Vol.II (Ubiquity) Elvin Estela (Nobody) teams up vocalist Niki Randa in the follow-up to the 2003 release "Pacific Drift". Here the surreal story is set around a near future, post-apocalyptic underwater landscape after a massive earthquake sinks the west coast. Dreamy, psychedelic, and a story to match. *jP*

DESTROY TOKYO Shapes (EBC) "Shapes" is essentially one big 19-minute instrumental epic sprawled across four tracks, bursting at the seams with otherworldly vocals, searing synths, and bombastic, enthralling percussion. Imagine a misfit group of Ewoks, disenchanted with the cultural void on Endor, not to mention the whole Galactic Civil War. They want to party, they want to dance and take psychedelic drugs. To this end, they sit together and with their ramshackle toys, they produce a piece of music. That piece of music is "Shapes." sF

MAMA ROSIN Tu as Perdu ton Chemin (Voodoo Rhythm) The little band from Switzerland releases its debut effort on the wild Voodoo Rhythm label. Described as "Combat Cajun", this is absolutely THE most KUCI-esque Cajun music to happen since Cochon Bleu. Put on your dancin' shoes and rock out, chere! jB

HORRORPOPS Kiss Kiss Kill Kill (Hellcat) Stir in a pinch of punk, a dash of rockabilly, and a splash of a tattooed vixen and you get the Horrorpops! You can't go wrong with a badass Danish psychobilly band whose twelve track record is about love and murder. bR

MINISTRY AND CO-CONSPIRATORS cover up (13th Planet/Megaforce) In preparation for their last world tour, industrial metal pioneers Ministry have released a cover album with the assistance of other "co-conspirators" in the rock and metal world. Special guest appearances include the likes of Burton C. Bell (Fear Factory), Josh Bradford (Silverstein), Tony Campos (Asesino/Static-X), Edu Mussi (Ascension of the Watchers), and more. Cover tracks include anything from Black Sabbath and Bob Dylan to Louis Armstrong. aZ

WINDY WEBER I Hate People (Blue Flea) Wonderfully beautiful atmospherical drones to reminisce about broken friendships and personal letdowns. Dark, haunting and disturbingly hopeless music to drift into a bottomless depression — full of sorrowful emotion with a longing for what once was and can never be again. eR

CLARK Turning Dragon (Warp/UK) Chris Clark is at it again, this time with Turning Dragon on Warp Records, though can justice be served in so few words? Clark has quite simply created an audio assault for the dance-floors of intergalactic space. Vocal distortions, rugged beats, fractured melodies and disjointed rhythmic manipulation all contribute to the next generation of assembled chaos in the post-techno arena. pS

BORN RUFFIANS Red, Yellow & Blue (Warp) Three fresh-faced young Canadians singing songs about growing up and liking girls, their hearts on their sleeves and smiles on their mouths. This is totally unique music, indie rock without everything that bogs indie rock down in the marsh of disinterest and cliche. The words sound like they are real and the music is wholly unpredictable: the drums, guitar, and bass lock in and out of grooves in unexpected and brilliant ways, creating a spatial sound that is as full when aurally sparse, as it is filled with strums, pounds, and melodic yelps. Nothing sounds forced and nothing sounds insincere, and the holistic result is one of the year's best albums. sF

WHY? Alopecia (Anticon) What the hell genre is this? Avant-hop-pop-rock-indie-art-folk-core? It has become evident that Why? mastermind Yoni Wolf and his band of merry pranksters have little use for your mewling human genres and are simply out to dominate your year-end best lists (which they very well may do). kO

THE MOUNTAIN GOATS Heretic Pride (4AD) You know, I wasn't totally sold on this CD when it came out, and it's still not his best, but damn it if it doesn't have at least five epic tracks that will see tons of play on my radio show. Lines like "I am coming home to you/with my own blood in my mouth...if it's the last thing that I do", or the title track where the lead character declares, "I start laughing like a child/and I mark their faces one by one" as the villagers rip him from his home to burn him alive prove that songwriter John Darnielle is a man not to be f*cked with. kO

ZIMMER'S HOLE When You Were Shouting At The Devil...We Were In League With Satan (Century Media) The ultimate, extreme metal parody band returns to give you a third dose of hilarity and satire, Canadian style. This time around, Chris Valagao & Co. aim their tongue-in-cheek cannons at the infamous glam rock and hair metal of the 80s, and they definitely don't take prisoners. Features a public service announcement with Nathan Explosion from Dethklok about the importance of learning to read. All the poseurs must die. aZ

R. SCOTT Snake Oil Elixir (Ventprod / Do Your Worst) This keyboardist for The Helmut Stein Experience, OO Soul, and The New Fidelity, with several on-air performances at KUCI, somehow found time to channel the smokey Crescent City barrelhouse with this personal collection of New Orleans vibes in his debut solo release. Able to cure anything. *jB*

F**K BUTTONS Street Horrrsing (ATP) Music for free spirited cutters. These slightly emo, fuzzed out scorchers will shred you to pieces and your soul will dance its way to heavenly bliss along the trance-inducing freak out jams. Just amazing. eR

LESS THAN JAKE Pezcore (Sleep It Off) This skater-ska band makes a big comeback with this re-release of their 13-year-old album. Your mom might want to wash out your CD player's mouth with soap after you listen to it, but it's oh so worth it. Why they didn't just come out with an album with all new songs... who cares! bR

MENACE RUINE cult of Ruins (alien8) Metal collides head on with experimental only to explode into a firestorm of rock — transcending all genres, yet unifying them by blending elements of drone, metal, noise with the dark side of rock. Thrash about, bang your head, fall asleep, or just let go, this music can bring you wherever you want to go. eR

THE LOVED ONES Build & Burn (Fat Wreck) A second full-length release for The Loved Ones, this album is made of pure rock 'n roll that can't drive anyone crazy, even when the songs get stuck in your head. Put this 30 minute album on repeat. bR

MESHUGGAH obZen (Nuclear Blast) The mighty metal juggernauts Meshuggah have finally returned with a new album. Their math metal techniques and technical expertise know no bounds. This album sounds a bit like their previous albums "Chaosphere" and "Nothing" colliding head on. It is both familiar sounding and completely unique, as well as an excellent introduction for those previously unfamiliar with these Swedes. Those who insist on maintaining their sanity need not apply. aZ

MARY ST. JOHN Some Leaves Turned Red, Some Still Green (International Corporation) Beautifully dreamy electronic music to float off and explore the most curious of all mysteries in the mind. From a place in the future where synthesizers rule all sound, a gift bestowed to mortal beings of the present, allowing for an advancement in musical synthesis. Quirky and melodic with a warmth of sound that soothes all. eR

MEAT BEAT MANIFESTO Autoimmune (Metropolis/US, Planet Mu/UK) Meat Beat Manifesto have always gone above and beyond the edge of electronic music production. Throughout the late 80's and early 90's, front man Jack Dangers pioneered a style that inspired generations of followers; a style that blends beats, bass and distortion with rhythms that unfold at every corner. To this day, he continues to break new ground with the release of Autoimmune, an album chock full of dub infested mayhem and rumbling basslines. pS

ULAAN KHOI I (Soft Abuse) Meditative guitar jams that seep through your ears into your mind and medicate your inner core — blistering the air it traverses. Yet this sound is at peace with all, producing a calming sensation as is swirls you around in a structured guitar distortion. Beautifully damaged sound fit for the mightiest of guitar gods. eR
