OLD TIME RELIJUN CATHARSIS IN CRISIS (K): On their seventh album in ten years, Arrington de Dionyso's recording troupe have crafted ostensibly their best and most holistically enjoyable collection of songs. Throughout the fourteen tracks, the sound is honed and fleshed out. Their basic formula is stretched every which way and doesn't go stale. Old Time Relijun make dance music for postmortem raves in dimly lit caves. - sF

BUILT TO SPILL FREEBIRD (Warner Brothers) Released as a promo single in 2002, it rules exactly as hard as you'd think it does. Built to Spill is probably one of few rock bands at present capable of performing this, Indie rock guitar god Doug Martsch goes to town on this jam with all the energy the bearded Idahoan can muster. This one is for every a-hole that thinks that shouting out the name of this song at a concert still constitutes a joke (it doesn't). - kO

NO AGE WEIRDO RIPPERS (FatCat) A thirty minute workout in noise-punk shoegaze pop. Equal parts blissful and visceral, the record is brilliantly paced, placing beautiful, dense ambient tracks between fist-flailing bangers that get under your skin and shake your bones. No Age want you to headbang, but they don't want to cause you long-term neck damage, because they care about you. And that is why Ulysses S. Grant was America's best alcoholic president. — sF

GIRL TALK GIRL TALK MURDERS SEATTLE (Bootleg) Track this one down online, it's pretty easy and completely worth it. Less frantic than his epic banger "Night Ripper", it has some of the old favorites, and mixes in a lot of tasty new treats. Girl Talk's proper album didn't have enough ODB for this lad's taste. This bootleg makes up for that. — kO

LOS CAMPESINOS! THE INTERNATIONAL TWEEXCORE UNDERGROUND (Arts and Crafts) A little teaser single to tide the pop-kids over until their first fulllength drops this year. The title track is a historically aware piece of pop that makes frequent reference to the likes of Calvin Johnson, Amelia Fletcher, Henry Rollins, and Ian MacKaye. The B-sides are an excellent cover of "C Is the Heavenly Option", and Black Flag anthem "Police Story", which is about as punk as a cardigan'd septet from Wales is gonna get. - kO

JEFFERY BROUSSARD & THE CREOLE COWBOYS KEEPING THE TRADITION ALIVE (Maison de Soul) A nicely rounded offering from this multi-instrumentalist known for his accordion playing with classic Louisiana band "Zydeco Force". No lame attempts here to fuse with bottom-shelf hip hop cliches; just Louisiana Creole swamp stomp, and all better than just about anything on that list of zydeco Grammy nominees. Eh Toi! - jB

ABOUT THE ARTIST

Alex Donis is a Los Angeles-based visual artist whose work examines and redefines the boundaries set within religion, politics, race, and sexuality. He has exhibited his paintings and installation works internationally in Mexico City, Syndey, Australia, Paris, France, Pretoria, South Africa and galleries and museums throughout the U.S. His work was recently featured in the landmark exhibition, "Made in California: Art, Image and Identity, 1900-2000," at the LA County Museum.

After September 11, 2001, the Los Angeles City Cultural Affairs Department cancelled Donis' exhibition at the Watts Towers Arts Center which was to run for two months as part of the official re-opening festivities for the newly-refurbished Watts Towers. The show, which was comprised of some of the paintings reproduced here, featured fictionalized pairings of LAPD officers and gang members dancing.

"I am outraged and equally saddened that people want to do this," said Donis. "I'm not taunting or ridiculing anyone. My work for many years has been to understand hatred in society and how, as an artist, to dissolve it by bridging vast social divides. This is something I thought I had succeeded at via this exhibition. Yet these pictures, these ideas, are being censored. My rights and my freedom of expression are under attack."

STREETLIGHT MANIFESTO SOMEWHERE IN THE BETWEEN (Victory Records) At least one decent Punk-Ska album has to come out each quarter and this time Streetlight Manifesto steps up to the plate. This album is surprisingly more Punk than Ska, but nevertheless is still Skalicious and hits a home run! - bH

CLUTCHY HOPKINS WALKING BACKWARDS (Ubiquity Records) Multi-instrumentalist, Clutchy Hopkins, comes out of hiding to deliver an eerie blend of dusty-bar blues, mariachi soul and hard times funk that sounds like it was recorded in a backyard shack somewhere remote, in a small town where kids throw stones at each other for fun. Also contributing to the project are Darondo, Shawn Lee, and Todd Simon. - jP

OPETH THE ROUNDHOUSE TAPES (Peaceville) The new live album by progressive metal masters Opeth is a two-disc set recorded live at The Roundhouse in London. UK. These Scandinavian metalheads have been fusing death metal with jazz, folk, and acoustic rock for well over a decade now, and magazines hail them as "Metal's most brilliant band." - aZ

MOTION CITY SOUNDTRACK EVEN IF IT KILLS ME (Epitaph) Pop-Punk enthusiasts listen up... Motion City's latest is fresh and fun, much like the vocalist's wild locks. Their song "Hello Helicopter" is just one of the many poetic tracks perfect for radio play. - bR

BLACK DICE LOAD BLOWN (Paw Tracks) They sample a sound. They play it, over and over again, while manipulating it in every way possible, layering on more and more sounds until the whole shebang is a twisted mess of melody bouncing up and down across the room like a rubber ball thrown by baby Roger Clemens. It rules. - sF

THE OCEAN PRECAMBRIAN (Metal Blade) This two-disc set is a concept record about Earth's geological history. Hardcore influences are combined with more progressive, even doomy segments for a truly unique listening experience by these rising stars. - aZ

VESANIA DISTRACTIVE KILLUSIONS (Napalm) Members of Vader and Behemoth return once again to bring you a dose of symphonic black metal. Their new album is heavier and more sophisticated than any of their prior outings. (For fans of Old Man's Child and Borknagar.) - aZ

OKKERVIL RIVER DAYTROTTER SESSION (Internet release) Available for free at daytrotter.com, these young Texans throw down three amazing covers and a jaunty remake of one of their most recent songs. The Carole King cover is great. The Nina Simone cover is amazing. But the John Phillips cover kicked me in the face and then never returned my copy of "Breakfast of Champions" and I still invited it to my birthday party. That's how rad it is. - kO

DROPKICK MURPHYS THE MEANEST OF TIMES (Born & Bred Records) Irish-Celtic-Punk bands are rare but they have the best music to drink to, and to this album I say "cheers!" It's a collection sure to please fans... and pub owners. - bR
